

Arnold B. Neiswonger

May 17, 1949 - February 21, 2020

Arnold B. "Pook" Neiswonger, 70, of Corsica, passed away on Friday, February 21, 2020 at his home.

He was born on May 17, 1949 in Brookville; son of the late Arnold "Tony" and Hazel Edwards Neiswonger.

Arn graduated from the Clarion Limestone High School in 1967.

He served in the US Army HHC 54th General Supply Group (The Big Red One) during the Vietnam War in 1969.

These are just a couple of stories I can barely remember but will never forget.

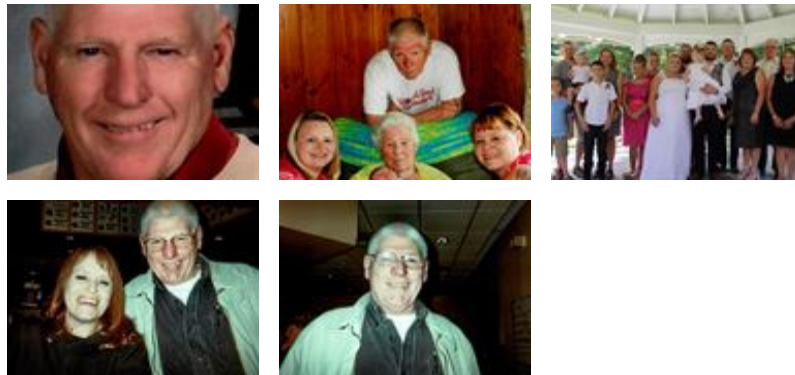
