



## Blaine W. Booth

March 30, 1933 - April 5, 2025

Blaine W. Booth, 92, of Strattanville, passed away peacefully Saturday morning, April 5, 2025 in the comfort of his own home surrounded by his family.

He was born on March 30, 1933 in Limestone; son of the late Blaine Booth Sr. and Margaret Thomas Booth Smith.

Following high school, Blaine enlisted in the United States Army proudly serving during the Korean War from 1953 to 1955.

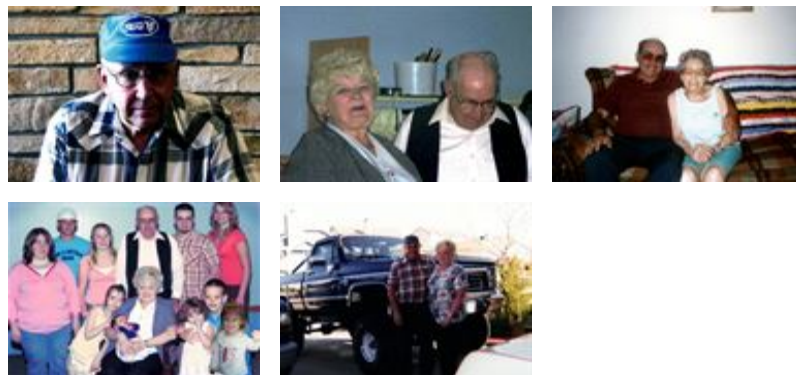
