Carol Ann Lackman, 65, of Rockville, MD, died on Saturday, June 9, 2012, at her home.

Born July 16, 1946, in Pittsburgh; she was the daughter of Willman and Jeannette Strattan Lackman.

Ms. Lackman graduated from Washington High School in 1964 and then attended the Allegheny General Hospital School of Nursing, from where she graduated in 1967. Upon her graduation she was commissioned as a Second Lieutenant in the U.S. Army and served until 1969, including a year in Vietnam. She went on to attend St. John's College in Annapolis, Maryland from where she graduated in 1979.

She was employed as a psychiatric nurse at the Psychiatric Institute of Washington for 33 years until her illness forced her to retire. Ms. Lackman was a foundress of the St. Gregory the Great Orthodox Church of Washington, D.C. and a member of the American Legion Post #432 in Cambria, California.

Surviving are two sisters, Kate Allen of Rockville, MD and Elizabeth Jean Lackman of Ebensburg; and two brothers, Willman David Lackman and his wife, Nancy, of Cambria, CA and Jon Dale Lackman of Washington, PA.

She was preceded in death by her parents.
