George A. Judy, 93, of North Third Avenue, Clarion, died Wednesday, May 11, 2011, at the Clarion Forest VNA Hospice House.

Born March 2, 1918, in Lucinda, he was the son of William and Melanie Schill Judy and was one of 12 siblings.

His early years were spent working in the family owned clay mines and he became a World War II veteran before fulfilling his boyhood dream of playing baseball. George signed with the Pittsburgh Pirates organization and played professionally through the late 40's.
