It is with heavy hearts that we announce Janet M. Bonnett Dunlap passed away on Sunday, February 2, 2025 at her Highland Oaks at Water Run residence, just a week after celebrating her 88th birthday.

She attended a one-room school house during her early years and graduated from Clarion Area High School. Janet also frequently went to nursing homes to share her crafting abilities and lead the residents in craft projects.

She was a member of the VFW Auxiliary of Clarion and the Clarion Eagles Club where she was past officer.

Janet was a devoted Steelers fan and in her younger years, she loved to square dance. Janet also enjoyed spending time with her grandchildren and

great-grandchildren. She was also one who openly expressed her opinions. Janet leaves behind her son, Tim Bonnett and his wife, Lou Ann; her grandsons, Nick Bonnett and his wife, Stacey, and Cody Bonnett; and her much adored great-grandchildren, Jacoby Bonnett, Abby Bonnett, Kelby Bonnett, and Boone Bonnett; along with numerous cousins.
