



## Max B. Taylor

October 19, 1928 - February 23, 2013

Max B. Taylor, 84, of Clarion, died Saturday, February 23, 2013, at his home. Born October 19, 1928 in Smicksburg; he was the son of the late Thomas M. and Grace L. Lewis Taylor.

He was married on November 27, 1951 to the former Donna Smith, and she survives.

A veteran, Max served in the Marines from August 1946 to March 1948 and the Army 82nd Airborne from April 1950 to April 1953.

He worked for Bell Telephone for 37 years.

Max was a member of the First United Methodist Church in Clarion.

He was also a member of the Masonic Lodge 277 of Clarion, Coudersport Consistory, Clarion County Shrine, American Legion Post 66, VFW Post 2145, Moose Lodge 101, Fraternal Order of the Eagles 3807, and Plumville Hunting Camp.
