January 21, 1913 - December 22, 2010

Silver Pasquarette, 97, formerly of Hartman Road, Clarion, died Wednesday, December 22, 2010, at the Golden Living Center in Clarion where he had resided for the past two and a half years.

Born January 21, 1913, in Greensburg, he was the oldest child of Daniel and Josephine Carrier Pasquarette.

In his early years, he was a miner and he also worked for the Pennsylvania Railroad, but most of his life he was dairy farmer. He was also a Wayne Feed dealer for 10 years.

After his retirement, Silver enjoyed gardening, fishing and watching television. Silver was a member of the New Rehoboth Greenville Presbyterian Church and was the caretaker of the Rehoboth Cemetery for 25 years.

He was married on September 27, 1941, to the former Mabel Hartman, who preceded him in death on December 9, 2009.

Silver is survived by a daughter, Nancy Hawkins and her husband, Donald, of Venus; a son Gerald "Jerry" and his wife, Carole, of Clarion; two granddaughters, Rhonda (Mark) Merritt of Guy Mills and Roxanne (Dar) Edwards of Cochran; and three great-granddaughters, Ashley and Emily Merritt and Morgan Cope.
