



## Terry A. Bish

November 23, 1957 - February 10, 2010

Terry Arthur Bish, 52, of Corsica, died unexpectedly Wednesday, February 10, 2010, at his residence.

Born November 23, 1957, in Brookville, he was the son of Larry N. and Sally A. Clark Bish of Corsica.

Terry was married on July 10, 1982 to the former Robin Nailor, who survives. He graduated from Clarion-Limestone High School in 1975.

Terry worked at the Clarion University of Pennsylvania for 34 years, where he was currently the Interim Director of Facilities Maintenance.

Terry was a member of the Immaculate Conception Church in Clarion.

He was also a member of the Eagles in Brookville.

Terry enjoyed riding his Harley, golfing, and helping his family.
